II. SAFETY EQUIPMENT

Required Equipment: All Vessels

- life jackets
- horn or similar audible device

Required Equipment: Motorized Vessels

- fire extinguishers
- flame arresters
- navigation lights
- rearview mirror
- muffler

Equipment Inspections

- TPWD officers may inspect any vessel for compliance
- Operators must permit officers to complete inspections







III. REGISTRATION & LICENSE

Vessels to Register

- motorized vessels
- sailboats (14+ feet)
- outboard motors

Registration Requirements

- Submit application fee and proof of ownership
- Keep card in vessel
- Renew biennially
- Transfer titles within 20 days of purchase

Hull Identification

Place identification on both sides of the hull.

- Registration number: Use block characters less than 3' tall
- Validation stickers: Place the sticker next to the registration number and nearest to the aft

MSD Certification

Vessels with sewage systems require MSD certification.

Operator's License

 Vessel operators are required to obtain an operator's license.

Boater Education Course

- Complete a boater education course prior to applying for an operator's license
- Register for courses provided by TPWD or

IV. GENERAL GUIDELINES

Prior to Operating a Vessel

- Provide life jackets for each person on the vessel
- Check safety equipment

Do not drink

alcohol and operate a vessel.

Violators will be **fined** or

imprisoned.







Operating Vessels

- Report injuries and accidents to TPWD
- Remain a safe distance from other vessels
- Observe safety markers and avoid restricted areas
- Avoid sharp turns
- Pull water skiers during daylight only
- Use headway speeds to prevent hazardous wakes
- Avoid anchoring in high-traffic areas

Miscellaneous Information

- Ask TPWD about certifying your homemade vessel (We require proof of the materials used.)
- When destroying a vessel, surrender the title to TPWD

Be safe. Your life depends on it.
